



MODIFIED POLYCONIC PROJECTION OF THE INTERNATIONAL MAP OF THE WORLD



All boundary alignments are approximate. The ultimate status of the State of Jammu and Kashmir in relation to India and Pakistan is in dispute.


HYDROGRAPHY
