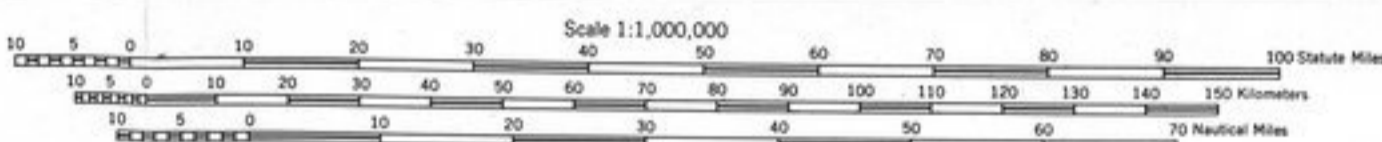

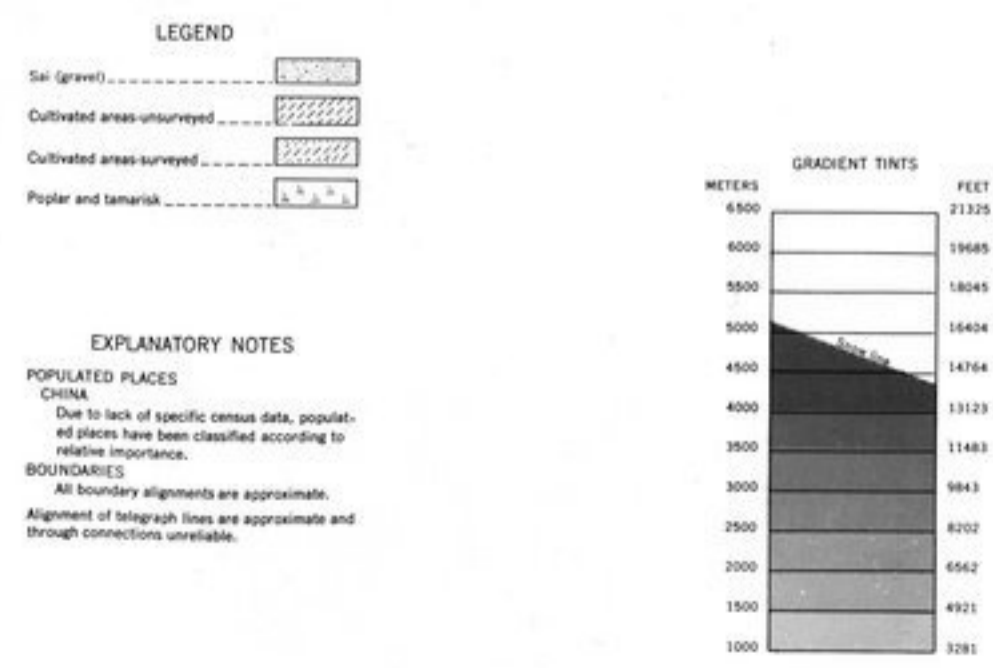
**POPULATED PLACES**
