

Äri-qaya : appears in the *Secret History*, with the Chinese equivalence Ning-hsia.

*Ärjäu; *j* = *dz*, = È-érh-chiao.
See ERGIUUL, p. 646.

Ärjis : this is probably the name read as Ärcis in « Sanang Setsen » (name of the Irtysh).

*Ärji'ü : perhaps Ärijä'ü for it.
See ERGIUUL, p. 646.

*Ärjü'ül : a form represented by Polo's « Ergiuul ». The final element, maintained in all MSS, is mysterious.

ärkä'ün : name given to Christians under the Mongols, no relation with Aryun.

ärkä'ün : Christian clergy.
See MARSARCHIS, p. 775.

Ärsu : « Ersu ».

Ärtiš : in Käšyari, for the name of the Irtysh (misread « Artiš »).

äsän : Mong. for « sane ».
See ESENTEMUR, p. 649.

Äsän-buqa : Manghutai's uncle.
See MONGATAI, p. 783.

Asän-tämür : in 1328 simply passed through Ta-ch'ing-kuan to enter Shan-hsi.

Äsän-tämür : composed of Mong. äsän, « sane », and tämür, « iron ». The son of Hügači (see « Cogacine »).

Äsän-temür : or Esän-temür, the Persian spelling of Äsän-tämür.

äsük : occurs for mare's milk in the *Secret History*.

äši qatun-u ämünä : one Mongol sovereign was put on the

throne « in front of the first Empress ».

Ätil : Turk., in Käšyari; Čay. (« Idil » and « Ägil » in the *Secret History*).

Ätil : (or Atil) this is the true mediaeval Turkish form of the name of the Volga.

Ätügän : name of the Earth-goddess in Mongolian.

Ä'udäči : > *Üdäči, probably the Üdäči mentioned by Rašid.

aržwrt : Uigh. (for the genealogy of the word « açur »).

Äb-i-Sangin : « Sangin River ». Name given by Rašidu'-d-Din, to the Sang-kan River.
