

- « Bodomal » : (« the white chamber of the Lord called... »); there can be no doubt that the word is the same as *budumal*, « painted ». See CINGHIS, p. 352.
- bodomal* : this must have been the pronunciation heard for *budumal* by the Chinese translator. See CINGHIS, p. 353.
- boḡuy* : Turk., in Kāšyārī, « colour » (Mong. *budaq*). See CINGHIS, p. 352.
- bodoque* : > Span., « cross-bow ». See BONDOCDAIRE, p. 100.
- boegies* : (*bougies* and erroneously *bongies*) Dutch plur. < Span. *bucio*. See COWRIES, p. 555.
- bog-to* : Tib., borrowed from the Mongolian. See COTAN, p. 420.
- BOGA.**  
Stands for Mong. Buqa, Buḡa; means « bull ».  
Buqa was the most powerful official in Persia at the end of Abaḡa's reign and during that of Arḡun. See p. 97.
- Bogda* [-ōla] : wrong interpretation of the Pieeh-ch'ieh-ch'ih mountain mentioned in YS. See ÇULFICAR, p. 611.
- bogdo* : Yakut, borrowed from the Mongolian. See COTAN, p. 420.
- « Bogōltuin-amà » : seems to be the same as K'ang-ha-li-kai. See CINGHIS, p. 324.
- « boguerant » : old French form for « bougran ». See BUCKRAM, p. 111.
- boḡasī* : (the accepted etymology) in Osm. Turk. See BUCKRAM, p. 112.
- boḡda* : (> *boḡdo*) it is a purely Altaic word. See COTAN, p. 420.
- boḡda* : (plur. *boḡdas*) Mongol spelling of *boḡdo*. See COTAN, p. 420.
- boḡdas* : Mong., plur. of *boḡda*. See COTAN, p. 420.
- boḡdaz* : pseudo-Uighur form, misreading of *boḡdas*. See COTAN, p. 420.
- boḡdo* : (< *boḡda*) it is a purely Altaic word, connected with Tung. and Oroč. *buga*, Goldi *boa*. See COTAN, p. 420.
- Boḡdo* : « holy », a comparatively late form in Mongolian. The evolution *boḡda* > *boḡdo*,.. is of the same type as Odon > Odon. See COTAN, p. 420.
- Boḡdo* : the theory according to which « Fu-tu » would represent it cannot be accepted. See COTAN, p. 420.
- Boḡhār* : the name of Bohhara in the Turk. dialect of Kazan. See BUCARA, p. 109.
- boḡasī* : or *boḡasī* (written in other dictionaries). See BUCKRAM, p. 112.
- boḡda* : this form still occurs in the *Secret History*; the evolution > *boḡdo*, *boḡdo* is of the same type as Odon > Odon. See COTAN, p. 420.
- boḡdo* : this form occurring once in the *Secret History* must be the result of a popular pronunciation. See COTAN, p. 420.
- boḡta* : a derivation of *boḡdo* from this Pers. form lacks support. See COTAN, p. 420.
- boḡta* : (read *boḡda*) this form still occurs in the *Secret History*. See COTAN, p. 420.
- bokesye* : Murray's earliest example in English. See BUCKRAM, p. 112.
- Bokhara* : (there is a Naubihār at). See BUCARA, p. 108.
- Bokhara* : occurs first in Chinese texts in the 5th cent. as Niu-mi. See BUCARA, p. 108.
- « *Bokhara* » : etymology of « buckram ». See BUCKRAM, p. 111.
- « *Bokhara* » : (D'Arvezac derived « brougran » from). See BUCKRAM, p. 111.
- « *Bolar* » : or « *Bular* ». See BOLGARA, p. 99.
- « *Bolar* » or « *Bular* » : name in the *Secret History*, Abū-'l-Fida, and Schiltberger, the « *Bileri* » of Plan-Carpine, i.e. Bulḡār. Said to be equivalent to « *Boler* ». See DARKNESS (PROVINCE OF), p. 619.
- Bolat* : (Rubrouck speaks of Germans who were extracting gold and making arms at). See ANDANIQUE, p. 42.
- « *Bolche* » : can be identified with Balkh. See BALC, p. 71.
- « *Boler* » : in Fra Mauro seems to refer to quite a different place far to the north. See BELOR, p. 92.
- « *Boler* » : in Fra Mauro for Bulḡār; misunderstood as « *Bolor* ». See BOLGARA, p. 99.
- « *Boler* » : it is the « *Bular* » or « *Bolar* » of the *Secret History*, the « *Bileri* » of Plan-Carpine, i.e. Bulḡār. See DARKNESS (PROVINCE OF), p. 619.
- « \**Bolgan* » : Polo may have used it instead of *Bolgan*. See BOLGANA, p. 98.
- BOLGANA.**  
— Confounded with « *Bolgara* » in most mss;  
— is certainly Mong. Buluḡan, « sable ». See p. 98.
- BOLGARA.**  
— The city of Bulḡār, the capital of;  
— the Volga Bulgars of the Middle Ages. See p. 98-99.
- « *Bolgara* » : name confounded with « *Bolgan* ». See BOLGANA, p. 98.
- « *Bolgari* » : a vair from Bulḡār. See ERCOLIN, p. 645.
- bolḡari* (> *borḡalī*) : gave in French *borgal* (see « *Bolgara* », p. 98). See BUCKRAM, p. 111.
- boli* : modern Maldivian, « cowry ». See COWRIES, p. 532.
- boli* : Maldivian, « cowry ». See COWRIES, p. 555.
- Bolod* : (Pers. Pulād) this is the only *noyan* Po-lo or Pu-lo in Qubilai's time. See CURMOS, p. 581.
- Bolod čingsang* : well-known Mongol informant of Rašidu-'d-Dīn. See DRY (LONE) TREE, p. 630.
- « *Bolor* » : a form devoid of authority. See BELOR, p. 92.
- « *Bolor* » : Polo's region mistakenly identified with *Boler* by Halberg. See DARKNESS (PROVINCE OF), p. 619.
- bolot* : Mong. means « Eastern steel ». See ANDANIQUE, p. 42.
