

- Nebile : according to Yule, it was already mentioned on two of Marino Sanudo's maps. It also appears on the Vesconti map.

It seems that it represents, with the usual slurring of final *-n*, a sonant form of *nākūn*, « servant », « slave-woman », unknown to modern Mongolian.
