

Nü-tzü-min : « Women Folk ».
See FEMELES (ISLAND OF WOMEN), p. 675.

Nü-yu : this is probably a graphic corruption of Nü-ku.
See CIORCIA, p. 379.

*Nürgä : (or *Nürgän) « Nu-êrh-kan » and « Nu-êrh-ko » point to such an original.
See CIORCIA, p. 390.

« Nurgän » : given for Nu-êrh-kan in Mongolian writing.
See CIORCIA, p. 390.

Nüči : according to Rašid, this was the name under which the Chinese knew the Jürčä (Čür-čä).

« Nüši » : wrongly said to be « Ju-čen »; may be a personal name, unknown to Chinese sources.

Nüši Täifü : name given by Rašidu-d-Din to the founder of the Qarā-Hitai empire, Yeh-lü Ta-shih.

nüng : Siamese, « one ».
See COWRIES, p. 557.

« Nyador-Ogdan » : (the Usurper)

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Thomas Herbert, in 1628, saw at Kāšān a tomb which was said to be his tomb; he meant Ahmed-Tägädär.

Nyetyin : this is the pronunciation of Nü-chén by the Coreans.

Nyōgo-no-shima : a fabulous island, off the coasts of Japan, was said to be peopled only by women.

*ńzi : this is the ērh in *tou-lo-ērh*, « tou-lo tuft ».
See COTTON, p. 430.

*ńžeu-ńžän : Jou-jan, the name of the Avars in the works of the northern dynasties.

*ńžjuěn : this was another pronunciation of juan in the T'ang period.
See CIORCIA, p. 382.

*ńžjung : this is jung, which may be the pronunciation for ērh in *tou-lo-ērh*.

*ńži-wäi-ńži-wäi : Jui-jui, with the meaning « flourishing vegetation ».

*ńži-wäi-ńži-wäi : this was probably Jui-jui even in the case of the Avars.

*ńži-wän-ńži-wän : this is Juan-juan.

*ńžwät-ńži-wät : Jui-jui, a southern Chinese form of the name of the Avars.

*ńži-wät-ńži-wät : this rendering of Jui-jui is not unassailable.

*ńži-wo-lák-kudi : Ju-lo-kuai, an ancient name of the Nü-ku mu-li of the Ch'i-tan period.

*ńži-wo-ńži-wo : Ju-ju, a southern Chinese form of the name of the Avars.

*ńži-wo-t'sia : this was Ju-chê.
