

Nü-tzü-min : « Women Folk ».  
 See FEMELES (ISLAND OF WOMEN), p. 675.  
 Nü-yu : this is probably a graphic corruption of Nü-ku.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 379.  
 \*Nürgä : (or \*Nürgän) « Nu-êrh-kan » and « Nu-êrh-ko » point to such an original.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 390.  
 « Nurgän » : given for Nu-êrh-kan in Mongolian writing.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 390.  
 Nüçi : according to Rašid, this was the name under which the Chinese knew the Jürčä (Čür-čä).  
 See CIORCIA, p. 368.  
 « Nüši » : wrongly said to be « Ju-čen »; may be a personal name, unknown to Chinese sources.  
 See CATAI, p. 222.  
 Nüši Tāifü : name given by Rašidu-'d-Din to the founder of the Qarā-Ĥitai empire, Yeh-lü Tashih.

 nūng : Siamese, « one ».  
 See COWRIES, p. 557.  
 « Nycador-Oglan » : (the Usurper)

Thomas Herbert, in 1628, saw at Kāšān a tomb which was said to be his tomb; he meant Ahmad-Tägüdär.  
 See CARAUNAS, p. 192.  
 Nyetyin : this is the pronunciation of Nü-chên by the Coreans.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 368.  
 Nyōgo-no-shima : a fabulous island, off the coasts of Japan, was said to be peopled only by women.  
 See FEMELES (ISLAND OF WOMEN), p. 683.  
 \*nzi : this is the êrh in *tou-lo-êrh*, « *tou-lo* tuft ».  
 See COTTON, p. 430.  
 \*Nzjəu-nzjān : Jou-jan, the name of the Avars in the works of the northern dynasties.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 382.  
 \*nzjūēn : this was another pronunciation of *juan* in the T'ang period.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 382.  
 \*nzjung : this is *jung*, which may be the pronunciation for *êrh* in *tou-lo-êrh*.  
 See COTTON, p. 430.

\*nzj<sup>w</sup>āi-nzj<sup>w</sup>āi : Jui-jui, with the meaning « flourishing vegetation ».  
 See CIORCIA, p. 383.  
 \*Nzj<sup>w</sup>āi-nzj<sup>w</sup>āi : this was probably Jui-jui even in the case of the Avars.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 385.  
 \*Nzj<sup>w</sup>ān-nzj<sup>w</sup>ān : this is Juan-juan.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 382.  
 \*Nzj<sup>w</sup>āt-nzj<sup>w</sup>āt : Jui-jui, a southern Chinese form of the name of the Avars.  
 See CIORCIA, p. 382.  
 \*Nzj<sup>w</sup>āt-nzj<sup>w</sup>āt : this rendering of Jui-jui is not unassailable.

 \*Nzj<sup>w</sup>o-lāk-kuāi : Ju-lo-kuai, an ancient name of the Nü-ku mu-li of the Ch'i-tan period.

 \*Nzj<sup>w</sup>o-nzj<sup>w</sup>o : Ju-ju, a southern Chinese form of the name of the Avars.

 \*Nzj<sup>w</sup>o-t'sja : this was Ju-chê.
