

亞麻 (Japanese *nume-goma* or *aka-goma*), *Linum perenne*, and Japanese *matsuba-ninjin* or *matsuba-nadešiko*, *Linum possarioides*.¹ FORBES and HEMSLEY,² moreover, enumerate *Linum nutans* for Kan-su, and *L. stellerooides* for Či-li, Šan-tuň, Manchuria, and the Korean Archipelago. In northern China, *Linum sativum* (*Šan-si hu ma* 山西胡麻) is cultivated for the oil of its seeds.³
