- N. III. X. II. Wedge under-tablet. Obv. 5 ll. Khar., clear. Rev. blank, but with cross roughly cut on it.  $9\frac{3}{8}'' \times (\text{max.})$   $2\frac{1}{4}'' \times \frac{3}{16}''$ . Pl. XVII.
- N. III. x. 12. Wedge cover-tablet; hole through pointed end. Obv.  $1\frac{1}{2}$  from sq. end, seal cav.  $(1\frac{5}{16}$  × 1"); strings and seal lost. One l. Khar., clean, running from sq. end to cav. Rev. 2 ll. Khar., much sand-encrusted. Wood hard and in good condition.  $8\frac{3}{4}$  × (max.)  $1\frac{5}{8}$  ×  $\frac{1}{8}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- N. III. x. 13. Rectang. under-tablet. Obv. 7 ll. Khar., good clear. Rev. blank. Wood hard and in good condition.  $6\frac{9}{16}'' \times 2\frac{11}{16}'' \times (\text{max.}) \frac{7}{16}''$ .
- N. III. x. 14. Rectang. cover-tablet; small. Obv. seal cav.  $(1\frac{3}{8}" \times 1\frac{1}{8}")$ , seal and strings lost. On one side of seal cav. 4 ll. Khar. running across tablet; on other side, one l. running across end, and 2 short ll. (or words) below. Rev. 8 ll. Khar., good black. Wood hard and well preserved. Prob. belonging to N. III. x. 10.  $4\frac{1}{2}" \times 2" \times \frac{1}{32}"$  to  $\frac{1}{2}"$ . Pl. XVII.
- N. III. x. 15. Wedge cover-tablet, exceptionally large. Hole through pointed end. Obv.  $2\frac{3}{8}$  from sq. end, seal cav.  $(1\frac{5}{8}" \times 1\frac{1}{2}")$ ; strings and seal lost. Traces of one l. Khar. running from sq. end towards seal cav., but whole tablet encrusted with hard sand, and chars. barely distinguishable. Rev. blank.  $13\frac{3}{8}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$  (max.)  $\times \frac{1}{8}"$  to  $\frac{7}{8}"$ .
- N. III. x. 16. Wedge cover-tablet; pierced at pointed end. Obv.  $1\frac{1}{4}$  from sq. end, seal cav.  $(1\frac{5}{16}$  ×  $1\frac{3}{8}$ ), seal lost; frs. of string remaining. Khar. char. (?) near hole. Otherwise apparently uninscr., but much sand-encrusted. Rev. blank.  $9\frac{1}{2}$  × 2 (max.) ×  $\frac{9}{16}$  (max.).
- N. III. x. 17. Wedge cover-tablet; hole through pointed end. Obv.  $1\frac{3}{4}$  from sq. end, seal cav.  $(1\frac{7}{16}$  ×  $1\frac{1}{8}$ ); strings and seal missing. One short l. Khar., running from sq. end towards cav. Rev. 3 ll. Khar., clear. Wood hard and in good condition.  $9\frac{1}{8}$  × 2 (max.) ×  $\frac{1}{8}$  to  $\frac{7}{16}$ .
- N. III. x. 18. Rectang. cover-tablet. Obv. seal cav. (c.  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " sq.), seal lost; fr. of string remaining, wood between string-grooves much broken away. Two ll. Khar., clear, across one end. Chip off one side (modern); otherwise hard and in good condition. Rev. blank.  $5\frac{5}{8}$ "  $\times 3$ "  $\times \frac{1}{16}$ " to  $\frac{9}{16}$ ".
- N. III. x. 19. Label-like tablet; small oblong, with hole in one corner. Obv. two columns containing groups of Khar. chars., or words, 7 in one column, 6 in the other, divided at bottom by short black line. Clear black writing; some sand-encrustation. Rev. blank.  $3\frac{1}{2}" \times 2" \times \frac{5}{16}"$ . Pl. XVIII.
- N. III. x. 20. Takhtī-shaped tablet, with lozenge-shaped handle pierced. *Obv.* 4 ll. Khar., much effaced. *Rev.* blank. Wood hard and in good condition.  $5\frac{3}{4}" \times 1\frac{1}{4}" \times \frac{3}{16}"$ .
- N. III. x. 21. Wedge cover-tablet; hole through pointed end. Obv.  $2\frac{3}{8}$ " from sq. end, seal cav.  $(1\frac{1}{8}$ " × 1"); strings and seal lost. One l. Khar., partially effaced by sand, running from sq. end to seal cav. Rev. 2 ll. Khar., clear, black.  $10\frac{3}{4}$ " ×  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " ×  $1\frac{3}{8}$ " to  $1\frac{11}{16}$ ". Pl. XVIII.
- N. III. x. 22. Wedge cover-tablet; hole through pointed

- end. Obv.  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " from sq. end, seal cav.  $(1\frac{11}{16}) \times c$ .  $1\frac{1}{4}$ "); strings and seal lost. One l. Khar., very faint, running from sq. end to seal cav. Rev. one short l. Khar., faint, and partially effaced by hard sand.  $9\frac{1}{2}$ "  $\times 2\frac{1}{4}$ "  $\times 2\frac{1}{4}$ " to  $\frac{9}{16}$ ".
- N. III. x. 23. Label-like tablet, roughly rectang., with hole in one corner. Obv. 2 columns Khar., very faint, one containing 7 words (or short ll.), the other 4. Rev. blank. Wood hard and in good condition.  $3\frac{11}{16}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}" \times \frac{1}{4}"$ .
- N. III. x. oi. Wooden mouse-trap, as N. III. x. oo, Pl. XVI, q. v. for full description; but of spear-head shape. 'Gate' lost, but pegs for same remain. See also N. III. x. o8. On under surface, 5" from narrow end, is incised Svastika, with extra limb projecting from inner side of outer angle of each arm . Farther along, a kite shape with long tail . Well preserved. Length 1' 6", gr. width  $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", thickness  $\frac{5}{8}$ ". Pl. XXVII.
- N. III. x. 02. Fr. of rim of wooden bowl; wood soft and perishing. Orig. diam. c. 10", chord 87, h. 3", thickness 3". Pl. XVI.
- N. III. x. 03-4. Pair of wooden legs or supports, broader at each end than at the centre; chamfered at sides and cut into segmental section at one end as if to fit round roller or other circular piece. Hard and well preserved. Cf. N. III. xi. 01-2. Length 9½", thickness at waist 2½" × 3½"; at segment end 2¾" × 4½", sq. end 2½" × 3½". Pl. XVI.
- N. III. x. 05. Fr. of wood, circular capital shape, chamfered below where it joins shaft. Weathered and split. Length  $4\frac{1}{2}$  width  $3\frac{1}{4}$ . Straight band above chamfer  $\frac{15}{16}$  broad. Width of chamfer  $1\frac{3}{4}$ ; angle of chamfer c. 40°. Pl. XVI.
- N. III. x. o6. Fr. of leather; thick, 'green', of shape of scapula. Hard, partly scaled. Length of sides 4\frac{1}{8}'', 5\frac{1}{4}'', 6\frac{3}{8}''.
- N. III. x. 07. Fr. of wooden implement, perhaps grainscoop. Handle and portion of concave body only remaining; body and handle at right angles to each other. Small hole drilled to L. of handle. Length of handle  $4\frac{1}{2}$ , diam.  $1\frac{1}{2}$ , portion of body 4"  $\times$  3", thickness  $1\frac{1}{8}$ " to  $\frac{5}{16}$ ".
- N. III. x. o8. Wooden mouse-trap similar to N. III. x. o9, Pl. XVI, but without 'gate'. Pegs for gate still in position. Surface much worn. See also N. III. x. o1. Length 113", gr. width 35".
- N. III. x. o9. Wooden mouse-trap, as Anc. Khotan, ii. Pl. LXXIII, N. xix. 2, and Ser. iv. Pl. XIX, N. XIII. iii. oo1. Flat wedge-shaped piece of wood, round at narrow end, where a hole is drilled for fastening to ground, and circular aperture 15" in diam. (for passage of mouse), 11" from broad end. U-shaped groove, c. 1" wide and deep, runs down middle of upper face of trap from broad end to within 1" of hole in narrow end.

On either side of this groove, where it appears on side of aperture adjoining long end of trap, is drilled a pair of holes,  $\frac{1}{2}$ " apart centre to centre. Beside the aperture, half-way between the points of issue of groove, on one side, is another small hole; and by it two others, irregularly placed.
