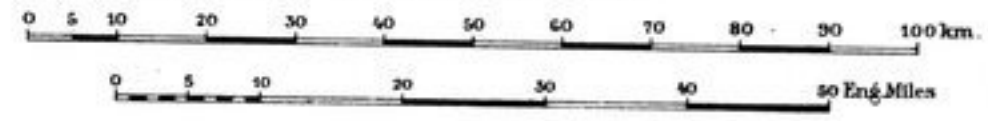


General Map of EASTERN TURKESTAN AND TIBET
