

1. var. *frigidum* Beauverd, l. c. 249.

Western *Tibet*, »ad nives circ. 4600 m. altitudinis, ad merid. fluv. Tsangpo (30° N., 83° 15' E. Greenw., leg. Sven Hedin, 1906)«.

This plant is not amongst the material which I have at my disposal, and I quote BEAUVERD'S words with regard to the locality.

2. var. *debile* Beauverd, l. c. 250.

S. E. *Pamir*, Kara-su valley in Taghdumbash-Pamir, 4315 m. 8th Aug. 1895 (flowering).

BEAUVERD'S habitat (»Thibetus occid., Kara-su») is wrong. Probably he thought that all place-names given in Hedin's collection were Tibetan.

3. var. *Hedinianum* Beauverd, l. c. 251.

Eastern *Pamir*, the left side-moraine of the Korumde glacier, 4367 m., 27th July 1894 (flowering).

Also with regard to this variety BEAUVERD'S locality is not correct (»Thibetus occid., ad nives supra Korumde«).

4. var. *pusillum* Beauverd, l. c. 252.

Eastern or Inner *Tibet*, Camp E = Camp LXV (25th Aug.), 5074 m., 15th Aug. 1901 (flowering).

BEAUVERD'S locality (»Thibetus occid., ad nives supra Sammon, 15th Aug. 1906«) is not correct.

Beside these varieties HEMSLEY and PEARSON (l. c.) record *L. alpinum* from Northern Tibet, Sarik-kol, 3469 m., 5th Aug. 1896, and Camp XVII, 5073 m., 1st Sept. 1896 (according to notes by Dr. HEDIN).

*Geogr. area* (of *L. alpinum*): Alps of Europe, Siberia, Pamir, Tibet, Himalaya, China.

East-Turkestan, Karaunelik-köl, a lake at the right (southern) side of Lower Tarim, 880 m., 20th May 1900 (flowering).

*Geogr. area*: Turkestan to Kansu and Mongolia, Wakhan (in Pamir).
