Northern *Tibet*, the shore of Kum-köl, Camp XVI, 3282 m., 28th July 1900 (flowering).

The few and small specimens present are with some doubt referred to the above species of which I know only the description.

Eastern *Pamir*, Mus-tagh-ata, Kamper-Kischlak, wet meadows, 4499 m., 29th July 1894 (flowering).

The specimens belong to var. *o*, *typica* Hook. f. in the enlarged sense of ENGLER and IRMSCHER.

*Geogr. area:* Arctic, subarctic and temperate regions of Eurasia, Arctic North-America, Rocky Mountains.

*Geogr. area:* Siberia, Kamtchatka, Pamir, Afghanistan, Tibet, Alpine Himalaya, Chensi.
