 East-Turkestan, Lower Tarim, Tuna-toghdi, 825 m., 9th June 1900 (w. unripe fruits); Middle Tarim, in forest, 1105 m., 10th October 1899 (sterile).
 Northern Tibet, Kash-otak, 2916 m., first half of August 1900 (w. ripe fruit).
Geogr. area: S. Russia to Persia and Siberia.

Fam. Juncaceæ

 Eastern Pamir, Mus-tagh-ata, Kamper-kishlak, damp meadow beneath the glacier, ca. 4500 m., 29th July 1894 (flowering).
 S. W. Tibet, Tokchen, Camp CCXI, 4654 m., 24th July 1901 (flowering).
Geogr. area: Pamir, Himalaya, Tibet, Mongolia and Northern China (Kansu).

Fam. Cyperaceæ

- Scirpus littoralis* Schrad., Fl. Germ. I (1806) 142; Ascherson und Graebner, Syn. Mitteleurop. Fl. II, 2 (1904) 318.
 East-Turkestan, Lop-nor, Kara-koshun, beneath Yust-chapghan, 816 m., 24th June 1900 (in bud only).
 The specimens are very young, hence the identification is not quite sure.
Geogr. area: Hungary (Heviz lake), Mediterranean region (scattered), subtropical and tropical Asia and Australia.
- Scirpus affinis* Roth, Nov. Sp. (1821) 31; Meinshausen, in Acta Horti Petrop. XVIII (1900) 251.
 East-Turkestan, Lop-nor, Kara-koshun, beneath Yust-chapghan, 816 m., 24th June 1900 (flowering).
 This plant seems me so different from *S. maritimus* L. that it must be considered a good species (see also my list of Cyperaceæ from Lieutn. Olufsen's second Pamir Exp., in Bot. Tids., Bd. 28 [1907] 220).
Geogr. area: From S. Russia eastwards in desert and steppe regions to Turkestan.
