

boundary line beyond which no one was allowed to step except Changfûnchuk. Usually I paid him a visit three or four times a day to observe his temperature, to ascertain his wants, and to administer medicine. No drugs which I gave him seemed to do any good, and my efforts to diagnose his case were fruitless. However, he began
