gratefully remember. As soon as I was permitted, I set out for Dehra Dún, to which I travelled by easy stages, stopping at Umballa to visit friends in my old regiment, the 16th Lancers, and journeying slowly in a dak gharry from Saharanpur to Dehra Dún. There I was able to explain doubtful points to the officers and computers of the Trigonometrical Branch of the Survey of India, where my maps were drawn and published. After a brief stay at Bombay I embarked in a French steamer for Marseilles, whence I hastened to England, and on December 7th, after an absence of two and a half years, I reached London so weak in health that I was scarcely able to crawl.
