

slipped a few cartridges into the carbine magazine and one into the chamber, for, when I was surveying the animal only a few yards from its head, he suddenly rose and, with an angry look and lowered head, seemed about to charge. A bullet from my carbine entered his brain and he fell for the last time. The horns were very short, measuring only $25\frac{1}{2}$ inches in length, 13 inches in circumference and 17 inches from tip to tip, though the animal was the most bulky our men had seen.

In Western Tibet there are a few gazelle ; hares are not uncommon, and ducks and geese are frequent visitors at certain places.
