

- Elúr, in the northern Karnátik, Lat. 16°, Long. 81°, and Elúr, or Ellóra, in the Dékhan, Lat. 20°, Long. 75° الوراء Tam.
 “Éllu’s (or *El*’s) town.” Rája El, or Éllu, was the founder of Ellúr. Mallet, in As. Res., Vol. VI., p. 89.
- Étava, originally Átavī, in Bāndelkhānd, Lat. 26°, Long. 79° . . अटवी Sanskr.
 “Forest.”

- Faizabád, in Audh, Lat. 26°, Long. 82° فيض آباد Arab. Pers.
 “The abode of plenty, or *Faiz*’ town.” Faiz, *plentiful, wealthy*, is also used as part of personal names.
 Anal. Fáiz-pur, in Kandésh, Lat. 21°, Long. 75°.
- Fakír-ka-kōh, a village in Sindh, Lat. 26°, Long. 68° فقير كا كوه Arab. Pers.
 “*Fakir*’s mountain.”
- Fāridkót, in Sērhīnd, Lat. 30°, Long. 74° فرید کوٹ Arab. Hind.
 “*Fārid*’s castle.” Fārid, *pearl, incomparable*, a personal name.
 Anal. Fārid-abád, in Hindostán, Lat. 28°, Long. 77°; Fārid-gānj, in Hindostán, Lat. 25°, Long. 81°; Fārid-pur, in Bengál, Lat. 23°, Long. 89°; in Hindostán, Lat. 28°, Long. 79°, &c.
- Farrukhabád, or Farrokhabád, in Hindostán, Lat. 27°, Long. 79° فتح آباد Arab. Pers.
 “*Farrúk*h’s town.” Farrúk, *happy*, a personal name.
 Anal. Farrukh-nágar, in Hindostán, Lat. 28°, Long. 77°.
- Fāth-i-jāng, in the Pānjáb, Lat. 33°, Long. 72° فتح جنگ Arab. Pers.
 “*Victory in war*.” Also used as in personal names.
- Fātihabád, in Hindostán, Lat. 27°, Long. 78° فتح آباد Arab. Pers.
 “*Town of victory*, or *Fāti*h’s town.”
 Anal. Fāti-gānj, in Hindostán, Lat. 28°, Long. 79°; Fāti-púr, in Hindostán, Lat. 27°, Long. 79°, in the Pānjáb, Lat. 29°, Long. 72°, &c.
- Fātuha, in Bahár, Lat. 25°, Long. 85° فتوحا Arab.
 “*Victories*.” Arab. plural of fath, *victory*.
- Fazilkakót, in the Pānjáb, Lat. 30°, Long. 72° فاضل كا کوٹ Arab. Hind.,
 with Hind. flexion.
 “*Fázil*’s fort.” Fázil, *the excellent man*, an Arabic name.
 Anal. Fazil-pur, in Sindh, Lat. 28°, Long. 69°, in the Pānjáb, Lat. 29°, Long. 70°.
