

Jaházipur, or Jaháspur, in Orissa, Lat. 20°, Long. 86°. . . . . جهاز پور Hind.  
 "Ship-town."

Jahnávi, or Janévi, a river in Gārhvāl, Lat. 30°, Long. 79° . . . . . जाह्वी Sanskr.  
 "The daughter of Jáhnu." With reference to the legend connecting this river's name with that of the saint Jáhnu, see Schlegel, Ind. Libr., Vol. I.

Jáipur, in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 75°. . . . . جیپور Hind.  
 "Victory's town." From the Sanskrit jáya, *victory*. The same name in Orissa, Lat. 19°, Long. 82°; in Upper Assám, Lat. 27°, Long. 95°, &c.  
 Anal. Jai-gārh, in the Kónkan, Lat. 17°, Long. 73°; Jai-nágar, in Bengál, Lat. 21°, Long. 88°, Lat. 23°, Long. 89°; in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 76°; Jai-bhúm (bhúm, *earth, country*), in Assám, Lat. 26°, Long. 90°. Compare Birbhúm.

Jälalabád, in Hindostán, Lat. 27°, Long. 79°. . . . . جلال آباد Arab. Pers.  
 "Jälál's town." Jälál, *fame, splendour*, frequently used in personal names. The same name in Audh, Lat. 26°, Long. 80°.  
 Anal. Jälálpur, in Bändelkhánd, Lat. 25°, Long. 80°; in Hindostán, Lat. 28°, Long. 77°; in the Pánjáb, Lat. 29°, Long. 71°; Jälálgārh, in Bengál, Lat. 28°, Long. 87°; Jälálgānj, in Bengál, Lat. 23°, Long. 89°; Jälaluddīn-nágar (*splendour of the faith, a personal name*), in Audh, Lat. 26°, Long. 82°.

Jalándhār, in the Pánjáb, Lat. 31°, Long. 75° . . . . . जालन्धर Sanskr.  
 "Containing water." The same name is given to the duáb between the Biás and the Sátlej rivers.

Jálapur, in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 75°. . . . . जलपुर Sanskr.  
 "Water-town."

Jalasór, or Jalésvara, in Bengál, Lat. 21°, Long. 87° जलेश्वर (جليسر) Sanskr., Hind.  
 "Lord of the water; also an epithet of Váruna, the Indian Neptune."

Jámálgārh, in Hindostán, Lat. 29°, Long. 77°. . . . . جمال گڑھ Arab. Hind.  
 "Jámál's town." Jámál, *beauty*, a personal name.  
 Anal. Jámál-gārhi, in the Pánjáb, Lat. 34°, Long. 71°; Jámál-abád, in Málabar, Lat. 13°, Long. 75°; Jámál-pur, in Bengál, Lat. 24°, Long. 89°; in Hindostán, Lat. 27°, Long. 78°.

Jāmgārh, in Málva, Lat. 23°, Long. 78°. . . . . جم گڑھ Hind.  
 "Jām's fort." Jām is the Pluto of the Hindús.  
 Anal. Jām-góng, in Berár, Lat. 21°, Long. 81°; Jām gāū, in the Dēkhan, Lat. 19°, Long. 74°.
