

Kidarkánta, Lat. 31°, Long. 78° . . . . . کیدار کانتا Hind.

"*Kédara's ridge.*" Kédara, or Kídara, a surname of Síva, also signifying *field, mountain.*

Anal. Kídarnath (nath = *Lord*), in Gärhvál, Lat. 30°, Long. 78°. (In the Asiatic Researches, Vol. XVI., p. 210, it is decomposed into ke = *water*, dar = *abounding with*, and is translated by *water-dispensing Lord*.)

Kiěnum, *see* Johár.

Kinduín, a valley in the Nága hills . . . . . Bermese.

Bermese name for "*Nága valley.*" Kin is the name of a Nága tribe; duín, *valley.*

Kíla-i-Dáula, in the Pānjáb, Lat. 31°, Long. 71° . . . . . قلعة دولت Arab.

"*Castle of wealth, or Dáula's castle.*" Dáula, *wealth*, may also be here a part of a personal name with Persian flexion.

Kishannágar, in Bengál, Lat. 23°, Long. 88° . . . . . کشن نگر Hind.

"*Krīshna's town.*"

Anal. Kishán-pur, in Bahár, Lat. 23°, Long. 85°, &c.; Kishna-púram, in the Dékhan, Lat. 16°, Long. 79°; Kishan-gārḥ, in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 74°; Kishan-gāngā, a river in the Pānjáb; Kishan-gānj, in Bengál, Lat. 26°, Long. 87°; Krishna-gārḥ, in the Pānjáb, Lat. 34°, Long. 72°, &c.; Kistna-ghérri, in the Karnátik, Lat. 12°, Long. 78°; Kistna-púr, in the Karnátik, Lat. 12°, Long. 78°; Kistna-ráj-pur, in Maissúr, Lat. 12°, Long. 76°; Kirstna-patám, in the Karnátik, Lat. 14°, Long. 80°.

Kisilkúm, a desert in Turkistán, centre about Lat. 43°, Long. 65° . . . . . قرلقم Turk.

"*The red sand.*" This desert plateau extends from the north of Bokhára and the west of Kókand to the south-eastern end of the Aral lake.

Kiúk Kiöl, in Turkistán, Lat. 35°, Long. 77° . . . . . كوك كول Turk.

"*Blue, bluish-green lake.*" On the road from the Karakorúm pass to Khótan, in a vast desert.

Koh-i-Sulaimán, a mountain range in Beludshistán . . . . . کوه سليمان Pers.

"*Salomon's mountain.*"

Anal. Kohát, *the mountain*, in the Pānjáb, Lat. 33°, Long. 71°.

Kolómbo, also Korúmbu, in Ceylon. . . . . Singhal.

"*Harbour.*" A less probable explanation is that this name comes from kóle, *leaf*, and ámbé, *mango.*

The "r" in Korúmbu very frequently becomes changed in the ordinary pronunciation into "l."
