

- Nagapátnam, in the Karnátik, Lat. 10°, Long. 79° ناکه پتنم Hind.
"The town of the serpents."
 Anal. Nágpur, in Berár, Lat. 21°, Long. 79°; Naga-thána ghât, in the Kónkan, Lat. 18°, Long. 73°; Nag-nádi, a river in Berár.
- Nágar, in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 77° نگر Hind.
"Town."
 Anal. Nágari, in the Karnátik, Lat. 13°, Long. 79°. Also very frequently met with in compositions.
- Nahargárh, in Málva, Lat. 23°, Long. 75° ناهر گڑھ Hind.
"Tiger's fort."
- Naiagáū, in Orissa, Lat. 20°, Long. 84° نياگانو Hind.
"New village."
 Anal. Naia-kót, in Nepál, Lat. 28°, Long. 81°; Naia-nágar, in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 74°; Naia-sháhar, in Rajvára, Lat. 25°, Long. 76°; Náii Sārái, in Bāndelkhānd, Lat. 24°, Long. 77°, &c.
- Nainitál, a lake with sanitarium in Kāmáon, Lat. 29°, Long. 79° نيني تال Hind.
"Lake of the goddess Náini." Náini was the wife of Mahadéva.
- Nainsúkh, a river in Hazára. نين سكه Hind.
"Consolation of the eyes." The river is said to have been called so by one of Emperor Ákbar's wives, who derived great benefit from the use of its water in an ophthalmic complaint.
- Naldrúg, in the Dékhan, Lat. 17°, Long. 76° نل درگ Hind.
"Nála's castle." Probably named after the hero of a beautiful episode of the Mahabhárata.
 Anal. Nal-hátti, in Bahár, Lat. 24°, Long. 87°.
- Nálla Mállá, a part of the Eastern Ghāts, between the Pennár and the Kríshna rivers Tam.
"The dark-coloured-mountains."
