

- Nasirabád, in Bengál, Lat. 24°, Long. 90° نصير آباد Arab. Pers.
 “*Nasir’s town.*” Nasir, *defender, helper*, a personal name.
 The same name in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 74°, in Sindh, Lat. 27°, Long. 68°, &c.
 Anal. Nasir-pur, in Sindh, Lat. 25°, Long. 68°.
- Nathdvára, in Rajvára, Lat. 24°, Long. 73° ناتھ دوارا Hind.
 “*The Lord’s temple.*” Nath, *lord*, a surname of pious men and of several gods; it is also often used in personal names.
 Anal. Náth-pur, in Bengál, Lat. 26°, Long. 87°; Nath-ram-páll (Ráma’s village), in Maissúr, Lat. 14°, Long. 77°.
- Nauagárh, in Bengál, Lat. 23°, Long. 84° نوا گڑھ Hind.
 “*New fort.*”
 Anal. Naua-gáũ, in Bándelkhánd, Lat. 25°, Long. 79°; Nau-góng, in Assám, Lat. 26°, Long. 93°; Naua-kót, in the Dékhan, Lat. 24°, Long. 69°; Naua-nágar, in Gujrát, Lat. 22°, Long. 70°; Naua-púra, in Khandésh, Lat. 21, Long. 74°, &c.
- Naubatpúr, in Bengál, Lat. 25°, Long. 85° نوبت پور Hind.
 “*Drum-beating-town.*” Náubat is the beating of drums at the gate of a great man, and náubat-khána is the large room over the outer gate of a palace, used for martial music.
- Naushéra, in Sindh, Lat. 26°, Long. 68° نوشهرا Hind. Pers.
 “*New town.*” Nau, *new*; shéra is another form of sháhär, *town*. This name is very frequent in the Pänjáb, *ex. gr.* Lat. 27°, Long. 68°; Lat. 28°, Long. 70°; Lat. 34°, Long. 71°; Lat. 34°, Long. 73°.
 Anal. Nau-pára, in Orissa, Lat. 18°, Long. 84°.
- Navabgánj, in Hindostán, Lat. 25°, Long. 81° نواب گنج Hind.
 “*Governor’s market.*” Naváb, in English commonly nábob, means *a governor, a great and rich man*.
 The same name in Bengál, Lat. 25°, Long. 87°, in Audh, Lat. 27°, Long. 81°, &c.
- Navapátti Tam.
 “*Nine villages.*” Buchanan’s Maissúr, Vol. II., p. 192.
- Nejibabád نجيب آباد Arab. Pers.
 “*Nejib’s town.*” Nejib, *noble, hero*, a personal name.
- Nepál, a country in the Himálaya नेपाल Hind.
 “*Abode of Népas (Nevárs?).*” It is derived by Lassen, Ind. Alt., Vol. I., p. 58, from Népa, the name of a tribe (perhaps the modern Nevárs, still residing in Nepál), and from āla, for ālaya, *dwelling, abode*. According to Hamilton’s Nepál, p. 180, the natives
