

Nurélia (also spelt: Newera Ellia), in Ceylon, Lat. 7°, Long. 81° Singhal.

"*Town of the plain.*" We were told that the name refers to the environs of the town: although it is situated in the mountainous part of Ceylon, its immediate vicinity is comparatively level and plain.

Omargárh, in Sindh, Lat. 31°, Long. 71° عمر گڑھ Arab. Hind.

"*Ómar's fort.*" The same name in Hindostán, Lat. 28°, Long. 78°.

Anal. Omar-kót, in Sindh, Lat. 25°, Long. 69°; and in the Pánjáb, Lat. 28°, Long. 70°.

Pāch Chúli, a group of snow-peaks in Kāmáon, Lat. 30°, Long. 80° پنج چولي Hind.

"*The five crests.*" Chúla, chúda, chūr, means in this country, *head, crest*, from chūl, *to elevate*. (The word signifying *fire-place* would be spelt Chúlhi.) It is one of the largest glacier groups, and also celebrated as the abode of the five Pándus, or Pándava princes. See the Chínér panorama in the Atlas.

Padshahgánj, in Audh, Lat. 26°, Long. 81° پادشاه گنج Pers. Hind.

"*King's market.*"

Anal. Pádshah Mäháll (mäháll, *house, place*), in Hindostán, Lat. 30°, Long. 77°; Padshah-púr, in Hindostán, Lat. 28°, Long. 77°; in the Dékhan, Lat. 16°, Long. 74°.

Pádun, also found spelt Pádum, in Zánkhar, Lat. 33°,
Long. 78° དཔུང་བདུན dpa'-bdun. Tib.

"*The seven champions.*" Dpa'-vo, *a champion, hero*; bdun, *seven*.

Referred by the inhabitants to a legend in connection with the foundation and former importance of Pádun. The word champion was taken, by our Lama informants at least, as signifying champion of the faith.

Pahárpur, in the Pánjáb, Lat. 30°, Long. 70 پہار پور Hind.

"*Mountain town.*" The same name in Hindostán, Lat. 27°, Long. 78°, Lat. 27°, Long. 79°, in the Pánjáb, Lat. 32°, Long. 70°.

Anal. Pahar-gárh, in Bāndelkhánd, Lat. 26°, Long. 77°.

Pāk Páttan, in the Pánjáb, Lat. 30°, Long. 73° پاک پٹن Hind.

"*The pure town.*"
