

Púndun, in Pangkóng, Lat. 33°, Long. 78° . . . . . ལྷན་བདུན་ spun-bdun. Tib.

“*The seven brothers.*” Spun, *brother*; bdun, *seven*. A group of seven glaciers, which I also heard called Mánmo púndun.

Púra, in Hindostán, Lat. 26°, Long. 80° . . . . . पुर Sanskr., پورا Hind.

“*Town.*”

Anal. Púri, in Orissa, Lat. 19°, Long. 85°, &c.

Pusetháng, in Gnári Khórsum, Lat. 31°, Long. 80° ལྷ་ཆེན་ཐང་ spu-chhen-thang. Tib.

“*The plain, or meadow of the puses.*” Puse, *a kind of mole*; thang, *a plain, a meadow*. Numerous hills are thrown up in this place, and are rather surprising in so great an elevation, where vegetation of any kind is so scarce. In the dictionaries we looked in vain for puse, but Mr. Schiefner, whom I consulted about it, kindly informed me that it might be corrupted from spu chhen, *long-haired*; spu meaning *hair*, chhen, *great*. For a short-haired animal of this kind might then be expected spu hrug, pronounced pu-shuk.

Rabanabád, in Bengál, Lat. 21°, Long. 90° . . . . . رابن آباد Beng. Pers.

“*Rában's town.*” Rávana, one of the evil demons of Hindu mythology, and a king of Ceylon.

Rāemánga, a river in Bengál, Lat. 21°, Long. 89° . . . . . راي منگل Beng.

“*King's happiness.*”

Anal. Rāe-gánj, in Bengál, Lat. 25°, Long. 88°; Rāe-gárh, in the Kónkan, Lat. 18°, Long. 73°; Rāe-máta, *king's mother*, a river in Bengál; Rāe-pur, in Audh, Lat. 26°, Long. 80°; Rāe-kót, in Sērhínd, Lat. 30°, Long. 75°.

Raghavapúram, in the Dékhan, Lat. 17°, Long. 80° . . . . . राघवपुरम् Sanskr.

“*Rághava's town.*” Rághava, *descendant of Rághu*, a name of Ráma Chándra.

Anal. Raghav-gárh, Hindostáni form, or Rāghēb-gárh, Bengáli form, in Málva, Lat. 22°, Long. 76°; Rághu-gárh, Hindostáni form, in Bāndelkhánd, Lat. 24°, Long. 77°; Rághu-nāth-gárh, in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 75°; Rághunāth-púr, in Bengál, Lat. 23°, Long. 86°; in Rajvára, Lat. 26°, Long. 76°.

Rahachóki, in Lower Assám, Lat. 26°, Long. 92° . . . . . راها چوكي Pers. Hind.

“*Guard-house near the road.*” Rah, *way*; chóki, *guard house, post*.
