

Shálong, in Kámáon, Lat. 30°, Long. 80° . . . . . ཤ་སྤོང་ sha-slong. Tib.

"*The place where the deer rise.*" Sha, a deer; slong, to rise.

Fine meadows, a likely place for deer, though now they are said to be scarcely ever seen there.

Shamsabád, in Málva, Lat. 23°, Long. 78° . . . . . شمس آباد Arab. Pers.

"*Sun's town.*"

Anal. Shamsgárh, in Málva, Lat. 23°, Long. 77°.

Shamshirnágá, in Bahár, Lat. 25°, Long. 84° . . . . . شمشیر نگر Pers. Hind.

"*Shamshír's town.*" Shamshír, sword, is here a Persian personal name.

Shángshung, a district in Gnári Khórsum . . . . . རང་ཕྱུང་ zhang-zhung. Tib.

This is an ancient name of the district of Gúge. If we are allowed to view Shang Shung as a phonetic modification of Zhong Zhong, which is translated in Schmidt's "Dictionary," p. 494, by *excavated, uneven*, it might be connected with the deep cuttings and erosions of the rivers, and translated by *eroded country*.

Shárba Tso, a lake in Bálti, Lat. 35°, Long. 76° ར་བ་མཚོ་ zhar-ba-mts'ho. Tib.

"*The blind lake.*" Zhár-ba, blind; mts'ho, lake.

The blindness is referred to the form of an eye, sunk in and blind; the depression of the lake, and its difference from its former level is here significantly alluded to.

Shayók, *see* Tsangbochú.

Shergárh, in Bahár, Lat. 24°, Long. 83° . . . . . شیر گڑھ Pers. Hind.

"*Sher's, or the lion's fort.*" In the Pánjáb the word sher is also used for *tiger*. The same name in Lat. 22°, Long. 76°, Lat. 26°, Long. 76°, Lat. 28°, Long. 79°.

Anal. Sher-khan-vála, in the Pánjáb, Lat. 30°, Long. 74°; Sher-kót, in Hindostán, Lat. 24°, Long. 84°; another modification of this name is Sher-ghátti, in Bahár, Lat. 24°, Long. 84°; Shér-pur, in Bahár, Lat. 25°, Long. 83°.

Shibgánj, in Bengál, Lat. 24°, Long. 88° . . . . . শিবগঞ্জ শিব গঞ্জ Beng.

"*Síva's market.*"

Anal. Shíbpur, in Bengál, Lat. 21°, Long. 87°.

Shikárpur, also Shikáripur, in Maissúr, Lat. 14°, Long. 75° شكارى پور Pers. Hind.

"*Hunter's town.*" The same name in Lat. 14°, Long. 75°, Lat. 18°, Long. 74°, Lat. 26°, Long. 87°, Lat. 28°, Long. 78°, Lat. 29°, Long. 77°, &c.
