

### 7. PROFILE OF THE BÓKO LA-PANORAMA.




Bóko La, situated on the ridge which separates the Indus from the Sátlej, is one of the higher passes of Tibet, and but little frequented by the natives. The view here represented, extending over  $50^{\circ}$ , forms the northern aspect of the Himalaya, from Kanáon to Bissér. These chains appeared to the best advantage from the foot of the pass, where the drawing was made, the view from the top being interfered with in this direction by some rocks. ### 8. PROFILE OF THE NÉLONG - PANORAMA.

These three panoramas, two of which are in immediate connection with the Bóko La, include the principal peaks of the Trans-Sátlej range together with its ramifications. From the Nélong, or Sangkiók pass, situated in the western extremity of Garhval, the drawing embraces an arc of  $70^{\circ}$ . Tíng Dóra, a pasture ground near Tíng, proved a very valuable point of connection for the peaks of this group. The view only extends over  $45^{\circ}$ . From its considerable height the view from Gunshankár was a very interesting one in an orographical point of view, the flat watershed of Central Tibet, in addition to the numerous snowy peaks, forming a remarkable feature in the scene. Though our stay at this great elevation was limited to a few hours only, yet we were able to lay down some of the most distant snowy peaks to the south-east, extending over  $60^{\circ}$  of the horizon.







### 9. PROFILE OF THE TÍNG DÓRA - PANORAMA.
